

First announcement of the Wolf Durmashkin composition award 2017-2018

International composition competition for up-and-coming artists on "Music and Holocaust": Call for participation in the Wolf Durmashkin Composition-Award.

Landsberg, Munich. With the Wolf Durmashkin Composition Award, WDCA, young musicians are called upon to deal with the Holocaust and to implement their ideas artistically.

The namesake is the Jewish pianist, composer, conductor and choir director Wolf Durmashkin, who was murdered in an Estonian concentration camp in 1944. The Music Prize, endowed with a total of € 6,500, is arranged in cooperation with the University of Music and Performing Arts and is based on the initiative of journalist Karla Schönebeck and Wolfgang Hauck from Landsberg's sociocultural association "DieKunstBauStelle". The competition is induced by the 70th anniversary of the concert of the "Orkester fun der Szeerit Hapleitah" (orchestra of the last survivors) in Landsberg's camp for displaced persons. Leonard Bernstein conducted the orchestra, to which Durmashkin's sisters belonged.

Works up to a maximum of 10 minutes can be submitted until January 10, 2018, subject to the following conditions:

Composition and cast

Category: Vocals and Instrumental

Cast: Up to five musicians

Instrumentation

Compositions are permitted only with the following instruments and vocals in free selection, which can be staged without technical/electronic aids.

Vocals (Tenor, Soprano)

and a soloistic ensemble with the following instruments:

Accordion, String instruments (maximum 2x violins, 1x viola, 1x cello, 1x bass), Percussion, (Percussion/drums), Clarinet, Horn and trumpet

Participation is open to musicians of all nationalities up to 35 years.

The works of the three prize winners will be premiered on May 10, 2018 at the occasion of the 70th anniversary of a concert, which was conducted by Leonard Bernstein in Landsberg and staged by him and surviving musicians of the Holocaust.
